



SOIL HEALTH WORKSHOP

We all know soil is important, but how do we ensure the latest research on soil is locally relevant and useful?

Farmers and farming systems groups need to have input into the research.

The new Cooperative Research Centre for High Performance Soils (Soil CRC) is a 10-year, nationwide collaboration between farming systems groups and researchers which aims to increase performance of Australia's soils to improve profitability for farmers.

This workshop is part of that collaboration. It will provide an overview of the Soil CRC and an avenue for you to have input into what it does in the future.

A team of researchers from the University of Tasmania, Charles Sturt University and the University of Southern Queensland are funded by the Soil CRC to help ensure research and development relating to soils is practical and useful for Australian farmers.
